



## GNOSIS AND THE NEW TESTAMENT

From the writings of Irenaeus (second century) to those of Rudolf Bultmann, "Gnosticism" has been a recurring subject in Christian theology. Interest in it was further sparked by the discovery of ancient Gnostic texts in Egypt in recent years; one of these, the *Gospel of Thomas*, attracted much public attention. Just what "Gnosticism" is and what its relation is to Christianity as well as Judaism are questions that are being debated by scholars and in time, will come to have an effect on the church's preaching and teaching. This book, by an acknowledged expert in the field, pulls together the various strands of the debate into the author's own synthesis and analysis of current thinking. 
