In the past fifty years, Americans have witnessed the emergence of an approach to international politics known as "political realism" whose leading proponents include such thinkers as Reinhold Niebuhr, Hans J. Morgenthau, Paul H. Nitze, George F. Kennan, Walter Lippmann, and James Reston. In this book, Kenneth W. Thompson traces the principles supported by these and other political realists and applies them to fundamental problems in world and foreign policy. He leads up to the ultimate problem, the conditions of peace in our era, and makes practical suggestions for a realistic approach that will tend to bring this goal closer.

In each area they survey the political background; the nature and function of political, governmental, and authoritative structures; the process of change; and the means of political integration.
