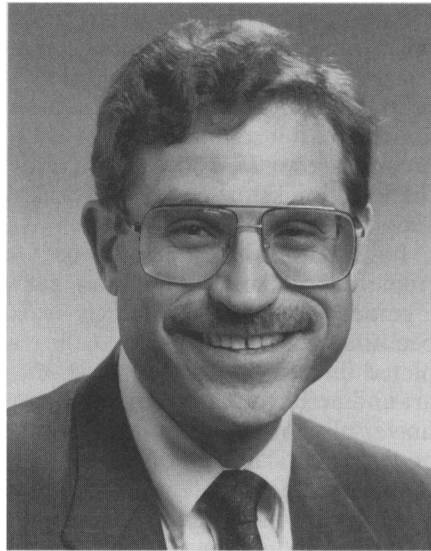
Neil Kerwin, acting provost, American University, was elected vice president of the National Association of Schools of Public Affairs and Administration.

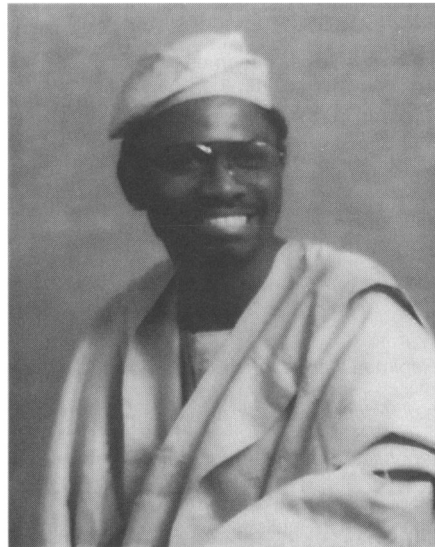
