During the last ten years extensive archaeological excavations have been carried out in Ireland under the auspices of the Division of Anthropology at Harvard University. This project, known as the Harvard Irish Survey, was concerned with the physical anthropology, sociology, and archaeology of Ireland. Fifteen sites were fully excavated, covering nearly every cultural phase from the beginning of the Irish Stone Age to the eleventh century A.D.

The activities of the Expedition were divided into two parts, one part dealing with the Stone Age and the other with the later periods. The Stone Age excavations were directed by the author of this book, Dr. H. L. Movius, who is Assistant Curator of Palaeolithic Archaeology in the Peabody Museum of Harvard University.

The primary purpose of the book is, in his own words, "to present in a comprehensive manner the results of the writers' research into the problems of the Irish Stone Age."
