A note to the users of this bibliography

This volume offers a new installment of the *Current Annotated Bibliography of Dutch Expansion Studies (CABDES)* to the readers of *Itinerario*, the research bulletin of the Centre for the History of European Expansion. It is the sixth issue of the series, covering the literature of the years 1981 and 1982.

As to the format of the present issue, a new arrangement was made by the editors and the compiler. It was decided to publish the forthcoming issues of the annual bibliography in exactly the same format as that of the "normal" editorial numbers of *Itinerario*. The Cumulative Index (vol. V 1981, 3/4) was the last issue in the A4 format.

Apart from the new look, however, this volume of the *CABDES* is a mere continuation of the previous volumes produced by Gerard J. Telkamp. It contains historical studies published in 1981 and 1982 and appears as *Itinerario* vol. VI (1982), 3/4. It was this compiler's aim to fill the gap, caused by Gerard Telkamp's departure in 1981 and the subsequent, but temporary freeze on his position, and to catch up on the bibliographic arrears. I'll do my utmost to bring the annual bibliography up to date again in the near future.

This issue contains abstracts and annotations of books and articles dealing with the history of the Dutch overseas expansion, published in the Netherlands as well as in other

countries of the world. A second category of publications covered by this bibliography are studies about European colonial history in general published by Dutch scholars. Monographs and articles of genuine scholarly interest and personal memoirs in this field were brought together; attention was also given to theses (as far as they are available through libraries or through the small library of the Centre), conference papers and reprints.

Finally, I would like to thank the following persons who have assisted in preparing this issue: Robert Ross and George D. Winius for correcting my English usage; Mrs. Sylvia Kleijn-Visser for the accurate and skilful typing of the manuscript; and Taco de Bruin for assistance in proof-reading.

I hope this bibliography will be of great use to all of you!
