Gender identity disorders in children and adolescents are uncommon and complex conditions. They are often associated with emotional and behavioural difficulties. Intense distress is often experienced, particularly in adolescence. This report, the first of its kind, offers guidance in the management and therapeutic interventions with these children and adolescents and their families. It describes the role of psychological, social and physical interventions and outlines the function of specialist teams. It recommends an integrated multi-disciplinary approach in the

assessment and management of these children and adolescents. The report was prepared in consultation with an international group of clinicians and researchers with a special interest in gender identity development and disorders, following an international conference in London. It is hoped it will contribute to good practice in services in this country and abroad.

This Occasional Paper brings together for the first time standardised model job descriptions for consultant posts in each of the psychiatric specialities. Included within each model are the College's recommended norms, indicating the most appropriate number of beds and consultant posts per 100,000 population. (These replace the norms contained in Council Report 16 *Mental Health of the Nation - the contribution of Psychiatry*, published in 1992, which has now been withdrawn from the register of current College policy statements.)

It is hoped that this document will be helpful to anyone with an interest in consultant manpower in psychiatry, including Regional Advisers, Regional Representatives, medical directors of Trusts and personnel directors.
