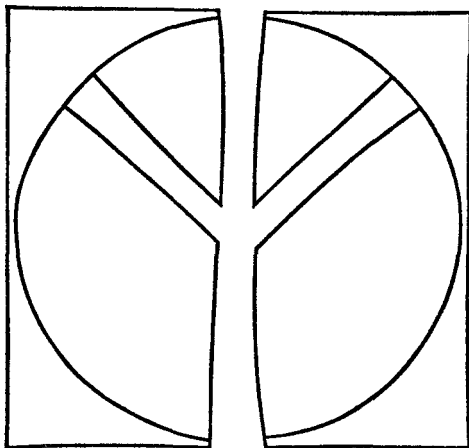

THE LOGIC OF LEVIATHAN

The Moral and Political Theory of Thomas Hobbes, by DAVID P. GAUTHIER. This book presents a reading of Hobbes's moral and political theories which, it is claimed, is both more faithful to the text and of greater current philosophical interest than alternative readings. The author departs both from the traditional emphasis on Hobbes's egoistic psychology and alleged atheism, and from the more recent emphasis on the laws of nature and Hobbes's alleged theism. He tries to show that Hobbes lays the conceptual foundations for secular and rational morality, based on renunciations of right, and for a political community, based on acts of authorization. He shows how Hobbes's psychology subverts these foundations, and in so doing suggests the relevance of a study of Hobbes to such general problems as the relation of morality and prudence. (\$6.10)

THE PSYCHOLOGY OF MAINE DE BIRAN

By F. C. T. MOORE. Maine de Biran (1766–1824) has been called the French Kant, the greatest metaphysician of his time. His works pose a challenging and important thesis in the philosophy of mind, based on the primary role attributed to the notion of the will. This book remedies past neglect of the philosopher in the English philosophical tradition in two ways. It performs the historical tasks of exposition and documentation, and the philosophical task of giving a sympathetic but critical interpretation of Biran's position. (\$6.75)
