Seclusion reviews in secure settings[†]

Seclusion can be particularly important in the hospital care of the most unwell or highest-risk patients. However, it can be controversial and clinicians have a huge responsibility to ensure its judicious use. This module highlights key guidance from the Mental Health Act 1983 Code of Practice and uses a series of videos to illustrate the practicalities of secluding a patient and ending their seclusion.
