

Architects and others wishing to submit their work for critical evaluation should write to the Editors outlining (on not more than one side of paper) the location, purpose and significance of the work and enclosing sufficient drawings and/or photographs to illustrate its quality.

The Editors and the Editorial Board regret that they are unable to enter into correspondence unless a submission is considered suitable for publication. Where a paper is returned, the author will be informed of the reasons.
