

According to this provocative book, the four Gospels of the New Testament are fictional narratives, composed as the culmination of an extensive literary and oral tradition—idealistic writings produced to serve a theological vision. The most familiar and powerful of these fictions are analyzed as literature: the stories of Christ's birth, his agony in the Garden of Gethsemane, his betrayal by Judas, his crucifixion, death, and resurrection. Scholarly yet accessible, this book reveals the Gospels as works of literary art—contrived, creative interpretations of doctrine and literary precedent that have become the supreme fictions of our culture.

Harriet Crabtree explores ten such traditional metaphors in modern theologies and evaluates their relative merit as particular symbols of God,



world, and humanity. She also assesses the manner in which such symbolic structures are utilized in religious life and thought, and gauges their viability in the contemporary context. Harriet Crabtree taught at Harvard University and the University of Massachusetts before returning to London, where she works for the Inter Faith Network for the United Kingdom.
