### Samuel J Zakon Award in the History of Dermatology

Papers are now being called for the twenty-fifth annual Samuel J Zakon Award in the History of Dermatology. This competition is open to historians and dermatologists in practice or training. Manuscripts should be submitted to

### Jerry Stannard Memorial Award

The 2004 competition for the annual award in honour of the late Professor Jerry Stannard is open to graduate students and to recent recipients of a doctoral degree (the PhD degree or an equivalent), conferred not more than five years before the competition deadline. The purpose of the award is to encourage research by young scholars in the pre-1700 history of *materia medica*, medicinal botany, pharmacy, folklore of drug therapy, and the bibliography of these areas.

Papers must be in English, French or German, and no longer than 50 pages double-spaced, including notes, bibliography and appendices. Entries must be received no later than 15 February 2004. In 2004 the award will be \$800.
