The Chinese Novel at the Turn of the Century

edited by MILENA DOLEZELOVA-VELINGEROVA

This collection of essays analyses the Chinese novel of the Late Qing period (1897-1910) in its transitional role between traditional and modern Chinese fiction. Nine studies examine the Qing novel in general and specific terms. Literary and cultural changes are placed within a political and social context in the introductory essay, while later studies develop a general statement of narrative structure based on detailed analyses of outstanding Late Qing novels. An appendix provides biographies of authors.

The results of these analyses challenge the scholarly consensus that modern Chinese fiction resulted from a radical change brought about by the May Fourth Movement in 1919; they demonstrate that Chinese fiction was beginning to change at the turn of the century, and the Late Qing novel, in a role similar to that of Modernism in Western literature, was instrumental in bringing the evolutionary process to a culmination in the 1920s. \$30.00

Japan's phenomenal economic growth in the past two decades has had a great impact both on rural society and on agriculture. Many new developments seem to be positive: farm household income, for example, has increased tremendously through non-farm work. 





Nichiren: Selected Writings

Laurel Rasplica Rodd

In addition to selections from Nichiren's writings, this book includes a thorough biographical study of the thirteenth-century priest who is regarded by many as an incarnation of the Buddha and about whom many legends have arisen over the centuries.

The biography is based on Nichiren's own letters and treatises, which are rich in narrative and contemplative searchings as well as learned exposition of doctrine. Nichiren's teachings and their import are described in a brief chapter, and a further section describes Nichiren's use of *setsuwa* (tales) and traces the relationship between the growth of popular religion and preaching in the Kamakura period and the outpouring of *setsuwa* collections.

Translations from Nichiren's enormous collection of writings make up the second half of the book. Nichiren's most famous treatise, the *Rissho ankokuron* or "Treatise on the Establishment of the Orthodox Teaching and the Peace of the Nation," is included. Numerous selections from Nichiren's letters to individual followers are particularly fascinating, for they reveal a good deal about Kamakura religious practice and about Nichiren's own forceful yet appealing personality.

Laurel Rasplica Rodd, assistant professor of Japanese language and literature at Arizona State University, has also taught at the University of Virginia. She earned her doctorate at the University of Michigan.
