The CDC offers a Rapid Notice Service (RNS) about important healthcare events. The CDC Hospital Infections Program provides occasional time-sensitive e-mail messages about important healthcare events (eg, outbreaks, product recalls) and publications (eg, new healthcare guidelines) to persons interest-

ed in the prevention of healthcare-acquired infections and antimicrobial resistance. This RNS is not interactive, and participation can be terminated at any time. There is no charge for this service.
