- £200** to Michael Rands, for his ornithological studies in the Andaman Islands, India.
- £200** to John Hatton for his vegetation and primate survey of two forest eco-systems in south-eastern Brazil.
- £200** to Dr David Chivers to attend the International Conservation Conference on the Barbary Macaque, in Gibraltar, June 1982.
