DOWRICK'S JUSTICE ACCORDING TO THE ENGLISH COMMON LAWYERS

This book is intended primarily for those who have been studying English Law for only a year or two. Its aim is to bring into sharper focus for them the views on justice at which they must inevitably have glanced in passing while reading the law reports, statutes, text-books and legal journals. Drawing on material from the past as well as from the present, this new work analyses the elements of the theory of justice motivating English common lawyers today. The views of judges are given special attention, and the opinions of many lawyers—whether written, voiced in court or in conversation with the author in the Inner Temple and in academic circles—are also reflected, so that the book is as interesting to practitioners as it is useful to students.
