## VACCINES

*For Prophylaxis against Respiratory Infections.*

THE micro-organisms most commonly found in patients suffering from "colds" are Pneumococcus, Pfeiffer's Bacillus, *Micrococcus catarrhalis* and *Bacillus septus*; and these are included in the ANTI-CATARRH VACCINE prepared in the Department for Therapeutic Inoculation, St Mary's Hospital, W.2, specially for the prophylaxis of colds in adults.
