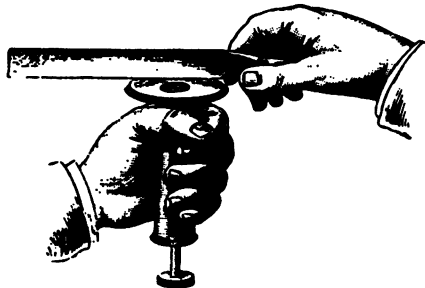
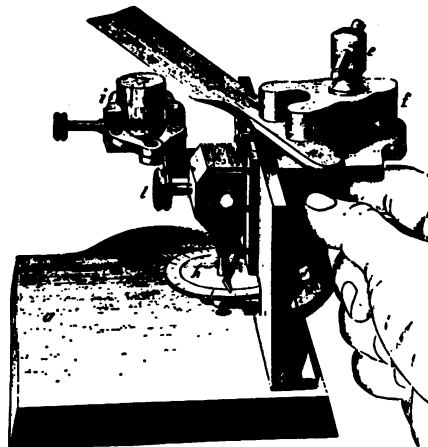


# A History of Microtechnique

Volume I, richly illustrated, contains essays by Wilder Penfield, William Feindel, Lloyd Stevenson, and Howard Denham.

Volume II, a facsimile of the English translation by Pordage in 1681, includes the anatomical drawings by Christopher Wren and Richard Lower copied from the first edition of 1664.

This famous book by the Founder of Neurology is printed on Spanish mould-made paper watermarked with the Willis crest and specially bound in Linson Vellum. Price for the two volumes is seventy-five dollars including postage.
