Aims and Scope

Tempo is the premier English-language journal devoted to 20th-century and contemporary concert music. It began publication in January 1939 as the bimonthly newsletter of Boosey & Hawkes music publishers in London, who supported its transformation into a fully-fledged independent journal and continued to publish it until the end of 2002.

Subscriptions

Tempo (ISSN 0040-2982) is published four times a year in January, April, July and October. Four parts form a volume. The subscription price for volume 68 (Nos. 267–270), which includes delivery by air where appropriate (but excluding VAT) is £101 (US \$154 in USA, Canada and Mexico) for institutions (print and electronic); £82 (US \$139) for institutions (electronic only); £26 (US \$43) for individuals ordering direct from the publishers and certifying that the journal is for their personal use (print only).
