The John Pringle Award 1985

An annual Award has been instituted by the National Schizophrenia Fellowship in commemoration of its Founder, John Pringle OBE, who died last year. The first award of £1,000 will be made for a programme or article (transmitted or published during 1985) dealing with any aspect of schizophrenia, including medical and social provision for schizophrenia, the plight of individual sufferers, and the acute problems of management which arise for relatives. The judges will consider the way in which relevant articles or programmes have advanced public understanding and sympathy for the plight of the schizophrenia sufferer.

Applications should be accompanied as appropriate by the published article (or series of articles) or a taped copy of the relevant programme, and if possible by a written transcript. A clear indication must be given of when and where the material was transmitted or published.
