

irregular Red forces. In the principal campaigns of the Civil War, against Kolchak and Denikin, no foreign combat troops were involved at all. British-American and Soviet casualties in the insignificant operations in North Russia (too remote to affect the main issue) were of very small proportions—far indeed from Mr. Fleming's ridiculous figure of 7,500,000.
