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
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SHANGHAI MUNICIPALITY

For simplicity, only the administrative outlines and the major railroad trunk lines are included in this map of Shanghai, while other railways, most waterways, and all roads are excluded. Note that within Shanghai Municipality, the City Proper itself is very small geographically, covering only 54 square miles or 140 square kilometres. Yet it has a registered population of 5.7 million people, plus an unknown number of unregistered residents. With a population density of more than 40,740 persons per square kilometre, Shanghai City Proper is perhaps the world's most densely populated central city. This high population density is rivalled by only a few other urban centres, including the old parts of Bombay and one section within Cairo City Proper.
