It includes basic vestibular physiology and pathophysiology, commonly used testing methods applied in functional examination of the vestibular organ, various forms of caloric test procedures using nystagmography, reading and evaluation of test results, particularly the nystagmogram, correlation with audiometric and neurologic findings, final neurotological diagnosis, management and treatment. Patients will be tested by participants and the history, symptoms and test results will be discussed in informal conferences.


