Dans le second cas, nous espérons qu'il apparaîtra à l'évidence que la manifestation de ces lacunes constituera une contribution positive à la recherche future sur le terrain.

Le C.A.R.D.A.N. se met à la disposition des chercheurs et des institutions pour leur fournir des exemplaires du matériel technique cité dans cette note, et des échantillons qui définissent à la fois l'objectif qui est le nôtre et les limites formelles et méthodologiques de notre travail. A l'heure actuelle le fichier sur les populations du Tchad compte environ 3 000 fiches.
