# **LAW AND SOCIETY IN THE RELATIONS OF STATES**

**by P. E. Corbett**

■ In this soundly reasoned and timely volume, the author of *Britain: Partner for Peace* calls for a complete re-thinking of the immensely important subject of international law. Arguing from the actual facts of international life, Mr. Corbett examines the enormous discrepancy between those facts and the assumption of many authorities that a society of nations with a legal order of its own really exists. He demonstrates how this assumption has come to be accepted as common currency and the effect it has had on traditional thinking.

■ Advancing the general thesis that law and society will grow only as the conviction of shared values grows among the nations of the world, Mr. Corbett protests the illusory importance attached to treaties, charters, and pacts. "Paper work," he insists, will not create world peace. True progress waits on an entirely new approach to the problem of furthering common interests and reconciling conflicting ones. Everyone concerned with world order will find in this book the material and the stimulus needed for a new attack on a crucial question.
