This definitive and fully illustrated series on the macrolepidoptera of Borneo will be produced in 18 parts over the next decade. The Bornean fauna, estimated at about 4,500 species, is typical of that found in the richest areas of South-east Asia; a high proportion of the species covered are found throughout the Oriental Region and frequently extend to Australasia.

In many instances reviews of genera or species complexes will be presented, enabling non-Bornean species to be identified.

**Part 3 (in preparation).** Superfamily Bombycoidea: families Lasiocampidae, Eupterotidae, Sphingidae, Bombycidae, Brahmaeidae and Saturniidae.
